NEW STAR RATING REPORT CARDS – OVERALL RATING BEGINS 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

The Ohio General Assembly passed House Bill 82 in June 2021, which included changes to the Ohio School Report Cards for schools and districts. Governor DeWine signed the bill into law on July 1, and it became effective on Sept. 30, 2021. The key provisions of this bill reform Ohio's school accountability system starting with the 2021-2022 school year. This reform was passed after years of collaborative research and design by education stakeholders, including the major education associations, business community and General Assembly. The new system has ratings of 1 – 5 Stars in half star increments. The report card components are rated with 1 – 5 stars and more details can be found in the Component Rating Technical Documentation.

Federal Identification Ratings

Ohio schools and districts were last notified of their identification status in 2019. All identification statuses were reset in the Summer of 2023, except for Priority/CSI schools identified in the Fall of 2018, which must remain in that status until they have two consecutive years of countable data, which is needed to meet exit criteria. Several updates occurred both at the state and federal level to improve the identification process, including:

- Updated language to align to federal identification categories.
- Updated identification entry criteria based on the Ohio's updated federal accountability system, including updates to the Ohio School Report Card.
- Updated exit criteria based on the Ohio School Report Card and availability of data.
